ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITES

Parents

Parents are the primary educators of children, the greatest experts on each child and the strongest advocate for them. Their contribution is vital. Parents have a particular role in:

- Making sure the school knows of any problems or difficulties, temporary or permanent, which may impede a child's learning.
- Taking a problem solving approach to difficulties. This means working with the school and the child to address problems and collaborating actively on approaches to dealing with them.
- To be aware that your opinion of others may be shared by your children at school which may make them feel less secure.
- Support children in doing home learning and more formal tasks, taking an interest in what the child is doing at school, reinforcing that with their own experience or interest and encouraging their child to be curious.
- Encouraging children to enjoy learning and to see the school in a positive light.
 Contributing to the life of the school as a community and encouraging their children to do so actively supporting school activities.
- Promoting an understating of difference at home. Explaining to children what bullying is and why it is unacceptable.
- Supporting school policies with their own children.

Parents Agree To:

- Let the school know as soon as reasonable about any issues which may affect the child's learning.

- Attend Parents' evenings.
- Ensure we understand school procedures.
