#### **ATTENDANCE**

Congratulations to Underwater Class who had the highest attendance of **97.9**% last week and to Bugs Class for their attendance of **99.6**% this week. Well done.

Our target for our whole school attendance for 2023-2024 is **96.5**% Our current whole school attendance is **96.3**%

Unfortunately, we have noticed that there has been a recent increase in term time absence. Please can we remind you that holidays are not authorised in term time. Any absence from school can affect your child's progress with their learning. All holidays taken in term time (of 10 learning sessions, which do not have to be consecutive) incur a penalty fine of £60 per child per parent. A session is am or pm. We will continue to review everybody's attendance every three weeks as part of our attendance policy. If your child's attendance

If your child's attendance shows no improvement by the next review point, a meeting will be arranged to discuss how we can work together to improve it again. #### **PARENT FORUM**

Our first parent forum of this academic year is this afternoon at **2.15pm**. Mrs West will be sharing the priorities for school improvement for this academic year. Everybody is welcome to attend and it will be a chance for open discussion and to put your views forward. We are also happy to take requests for parent forums of matters that you would like to raise.

#### **CENSUS DAY AND UIFSM – THURSDAY 5th OCTOBER 2023**

On Thursday 5th October 2023, it is national School Census Day and, in an effort, to increase the uptake of the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) on that day, the menu will be Fish and Chips. There will also be a jacket potato on offer on this day.

Census Day is when the Local Authorities collect information electronically from every school in their area, partly to guide them in planning and funding. They collect details such as pupil numbers, numbers of pupils with Special Educational Needs, entitled to Pupil Premium funding, entitled to Free School Meals, attendance information and so forth. One thing in particular they are looking at this term is the number of children taking the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM), to provide schools with appropriate funding for this service such as utility costs.

To maximise our potential funding, we would encourage all families with children entitled to UIFSM to enjoy their free meal on Thursday 5th October, rather than bringing a packed lunch that day. It is the number of children in Key Stage One eating the free meal on the actual day's lunchtime that informs our funding, rather than meals ordered for that day or children attending school. Pupils who bring a packed lunch from home unfortunately are not able to be included, nor are children who normally take UIFSM, but who are absent on 5th October. Once again, we encourage as many as possible to commit to eating the UIFSM on Thursday that week; this will record those children as having eaten on Census Day and therefore count towards the total Government funding that will be allocated to our school for UIFSM for a whole year. We hope that it will also create some enthusiasm amongst the children who don't normally take the meals and lead to more of them eating over the rest of the school year.

#### **SAFEGUARDING**

At Laughton Primary School, safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility and our top priority. All professionals who come in to contact with children and their families have a role to play. Within school, we have a number of staff members who are responsible or leading on child protection and welfare. We would like take this opportunity to remind you of who to contact if you have a welfare concern about a child. If you are worried about a child's safety, please do not hesitate to contact any of the Designated Safeguarding Lead staff members straight away.

#### **CHANGING WEATHER**

Now that the weather is changing, please can we remind you that all children should have a coat in school every day.

#### **HEADLICE**

We have become aware that we have cases of headlice in school at the moment. It is important that you check the whole family's hair as soon as possible.

You can do this using a special comb (widely available from chemists), a lot of hair conditioner and careful combing from root to tip every 3 days over a 2-week period. Conditioner helps make the hair slippery. This makes the hair easier to comb and the lice easier to remove. It is important that you remove the lice from the comb each time you put the comb through the hair and that you continue to comb regularly over the full two weeks as this breaks the egg/lice life cycle. We recommend the Nitty Gritty comb as a particularly effective comb for getting rid of lice. This is because unlike most combs it removes the little eggs as well as the larger and more visible lice. It is a metal comb with special rounded end teeth, which is slightly more expensive than most lice combs, but very efficient at removing even tiny eggs and lice. It is widely available (from Amazon, Boots, Tesco, Lloyds Pharmacy and many more). We ask that children with long hair have it tied back.

#### **PARENT CONSULTATIONS**

The online booking window for our parent consultations on **17th** and **19th October** will open on 6<sup>th</sup> October You will need to use your parent eSchool login (not your child's) to access this so it would be helpful to check you still have your parent login information so that you can access the bookings when they become available. #### **SCHOOL COUNCIL**

The children were informed in assembly this morning about applying to be on the School Council for this academic year.

If your child is interested in becoming a school councillor then they will have collected a manifesto sheet to fill in so that they can share why they want to be a councillor and what they want to do. These will then be displayed in the hall.

Please can these be returned to school in preparation for our class votes next Thursday when the children will read out their manifestoes to their year group and then vote anonymously to see who is elected.

We hope to announce the new School Council members in assembly next week so that they can help with the Macmillan coffee afternoon.

#### **FLU VACCINATIONS**
