#### **YEAR 4 SWIMMING**

A letter will be sent home on Monday for Year 4 children who start their swimming lessons in January. Children need to be able to swim 25m before leaving Primary school and those that can, will be given further challenges through life saving skills and speed of stroke etc so it is a fantastic opportunity. The year 4 children from Firle will also be attending. Please remember to give permission and make payment via your Arbor parent portal by 19th December.

#### **STAFFING**

Mrs Waters popped in the other week and saw High Peaks class. She is looking forward to returning to school after her maternity leave. She will be coming back in term 4 after February half term, temporarily job sharing with Mrs Tyson, covering on Thursdays and Fridays then will be full time after the Easter holidays. We are very grateful to Mrs Cliff who has provided some consistency since Mrs Waters went on maternity leave and to Mrs Tyson who is keen to be fully involved following her period of sickness absence. I'm sure you have seen in the news how difficult recruitment is at present in school and thank you for your support at this time.

#### **HEADLICE**

We have become aware that we have cases of headlice in school at the moment. It is important that you check the whole family's hair as soon as possible.

You can do this using a special comb (widely available from chemists), a lot of hair conditioner and careful combing from root to tip every 3 days over a 2-week period. Conditioner helps make the hair slippery. This makes the hair easier to comb and the lice easier to remove. It is important that you remove the lice from the comb each time you put the comb through the hair and that you continue to comb regularly over the full two weeks as this breaks the egg/lice life cycle. We recommend the Nitty Gritty comb as a particularly effective comb for getting rid of lice. This is because unlike most combs it removes the little eggs as well as the larger and more visible lice. It is a metal comb with special rounded end teeth, which is slightly more expensive than most lice combs, but very efficient at removing even tiny eggs and lice. It is widely available (from Amazon, Boots, Tesco, Lloyds Pharmacy and many more)

They have worked so hard to learn their lines and spoke beautifully to the audience. Everybody did a fabulous job and should be very proud of themselves.
