#### ATTENDANCE


Congratulations to Underwater and Bugs classes who both had the highest attendance of **100%** this week. Well done.

Please can we ask everyone to be mindful of safety when driving and parking on Church Lane and in the village car park. This can also cause issues for our neighbours who cannot access their property. Please allow extra time to park and drive slowly down the lane, thank you.

Can we also remind you that we are a **NUT FREE** school and pack lunches from home must not contain any foods containing nuts, including chocolate spread, cereal bars e.t.c. We continue to promote healthy eating in school and therefore ask that chocolate bars and sweets are not included in packed lunches. Small chocolate covered biscuits – Kit Kats, Penguin bars etc are fine. As a rule of thumb, if it is in the biscuit aisle, it is a biscuit; therefore ok in school.

## **PARENT FORUM**

## **UNIFORM**

It is great to see the children back in their full school uniform. Please ensure that they stick to the correct uniform; see below.

- Green or white polo or white shirt
- School sweatshirt/ fleece
- Green cardigan/ V neck jumper
- Grey trousers/shorts/culottes/skirt/pinafore
- White or grey socks, grey or green tights
- Green and white checked summer dress
- Black shoes/ boots (no sandals please)
- Long hair tied back
- No jewellery except for small plain stud earrings and a watch
- No nail varnish or make up

P.E kits need to be in everyday and can go home to be washed every few weeks or half term for the infants. Uniforms can be purchased from the uniform website or a provider of your choice. The LSA will also be running second hand uniform sales. Please see the diary section for upcoming dates.

We will continue to have a uniform draw each term on a random day when all the children, who are in the correct school uniform on that day will have their names go into a hat and one will be picked out for each class. The winner will receive a £3 WH Smith voucher. This is to help support our uniform policy. If you are having any difficulties purchasing a uniform then please speak to the school office.

Please make sure that any long hair e.g. reaching shoulders is tied back and avoid elaborate accessories.

## **ESCHOOL LEARNING PLATFORM**

We will continue to use our learning platform to share the children's home learning, please can you check that you are still able to log on to your child's individual page.

You also have a separate parent login which you will need to book parents evening towards the end of term 1. Therefore, please can you make sure that you can access this account as well. If you have any problems, or have forgotten the login details, please contact Mrs Geer.

Children who started our school in September will receive their logins shortly for this. Please contact Mrs Geer in the school office if you have any difficulties logging on.

## **DATA COLLECTION**

At the start of every academic year, we update our contact details for the children. I'm sure you can appreciate it is imperative that we have up to date information in case of an emergency.

If you haven't done so already, and you need to notify us of any changes, please complete the blank form attached and return it by Monday to prevent office staff having to chase. ## KS2 FRUIT AND SNACKS

All KS1 and EYFS children are given a fruit or vegetable snack through the government healthy school initiative. If you would like your child to receive this in KS2 then you will need to order through the office. The cost of this is £3 per term.

If you wish your child to bring in a snack from home then please make sure that it is only fresh fruit or vegetables, thank you.

## SCHOOL DINNERS

From September, a daily lunch for KS2 children will cost **£2.85**, therefore a weekly cost of **£14.25**. If you would like to pay for the whole of the first term (minus INSET days) the price will be **£94.05**. Just a reminder that pupils moving into Year 3 will have to register for Parent pay if their child is having paid school dinners from September. The school office sent out the registration codes this week. Please let the office know if you haven't received this. The menu for this term was sent home before the holidays and can be found on the school website.

Please could everyone ensure that their parent pay accounts have no outstanding balances at the end of every week. This will help the office as we will not have to chase any debt owed as this can take up a lot of time for office staff. If there remains an outstanding balance on a Friday, you will be asked to send a packed lunch in for the following week, or until the debt is paid.

## BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast club has started on a **Monday** and **Wednesday** starting from **7:45am**. Children are provided with a nutritious breakfast, comprising of a choice of healthy cereals, toast, fruit, yoghurt or pancakes. Children will participate in an activity until 8:35am when they will join the other children on the playground and be supervised by the teacher on duty.

The sessions are **£5 per child per session**, which will include breakfast and participation in the activity that day. This can be paid for by BACs or cheque to the school office. To ensure the sustainability of the club we will require parents and carers to sign up to this termly, as we need 2 members of staff to run it. You can select your days and we will offer places on a first come, first served basis. You do, however, need to book a minimum of 1 session per week. If you would like to book a place from September for the first term, please contact the school office. Places must be booked in advance and you will then be contacted to confirm your place.

On **Thursdays** Sports Cool Brighton will be offering a morning club. This will be £5 per session which should be made to the school office. This will start at **8am** and children will also be offered breakfast. Sports Cool Brighton will bring a variety of games and activities dependant on group size, ages and weather, such as archery, frisbee, and golf etc. They will also have games like Jenga, connect 4, and dominoes for those who prefer quiet time.
